EVERYONE is introducing themselves, and it really easy to say "Hey come with me to this (ministry sponsored) barbeque, Ultimate Frisbee, Bible study, large group etc."

What would it be like in CNY if all the students going to SU/ESF, Lemoyne, or OCC already knew each of the many campus ministries, were getting help from upper classmen, knew the other believers in their dorm, and had a calendar with all ministry events? We've seen the fruit of this before and believe these incoming freshmen will see many come to Christ --- and be transformed in their own faith in the process! The typical 70% loss to the faith is <u>replaced by growth</u>.
